The Office of Financial Research is a new organization, established under the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act within the Treasury Department to support the Financial Stability Oversight Council via research and analysis of the financial system's stability. In support of this research function, the Office is empowered to collect the data required to assess, evaluate and monitor threats to financial stability. The OFR seeks to attract researchers from many different disciplines relevant to systemic risk, data management and analysis, and financial networks.

The Research and Analysis Center within OFR is seeking Masters of Financial Engineering and other quantitatively-oriented students and recent graduates to join our organization. Strong applicants should be able to demonstrate:

- Advanced knowledge of finance principles, standards, theories, practices, concepts, and techniques, and skill and ability to apply this knowledge;
- Excellent problem-solving skills, combining knowledge of finance, computing and quantitative methods
- Advanced programming experience in SAS, MATLAB, Stata, or similar programs such as R or C++, and applying current technologies, protocols, and best practices in statistical programming;
- Assembling, managing, and analyzing financial data such as a large panel of corporate financial information, stock returns, trades, quotes, or orders;
- Knowledge or potential for analyzing key policy issues and producing analysis that addresses the economic implications indicated by that research;
- Communication skills to convey complex and technical information both orally and in writing.
- Strong interpersonal skills to interact effectively with senior officials, supervisors, co-workers, industry staff, and the general public.

Positions may be filled using Treasury's excepted service (Schedule A) hiring authority, Intergovernmental Personnel Act or Fellows Program.
