

**UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY
SECTION 105(a) TROUBLED ASSETS RELIEF PROGRAM
REPORT TO CONGRESS
FOR THE PERIOD
FEBRUARY 1, 2009 TO FEBRUARY 28, 2009**

I. OVERVIEW

During this reporting period, Treasury continued to develop and implement programs under the Troubled Assets Relief Program (TARP) designed to restore stability and liquidity to the U.S. financial system while safeguarding taxpayer interests. On February 10, 2009, Treasury announced the framework of its Financial Stability Plan (FSP) that will further strengthen our financial system, restore the flow of credit to consumers and businesses, and support the U.S. economy. Specifically, Treasury announced the following new measures:

- Treasury established the Capital Assistance Program (CAP) to ensure that U.S. financial institutions have sufficient capital to lend to creditworthy borrowers in a weaker than expected economic environment. The CAP is a 2-pronged program that includes a supervisory exercise by bank regulators to produce a more consistent and forward-looking assessment of the risks on banks' balance sheets and their potential capital needs, and a new capital access program for qualifying financial institutions;
- Treasury and the Federal Reserve released further details on the Term Asset-Backed Securities Loan Facility (TALF), a component of the newly established Consumer and Business Lending Initiative. The TALF is a Federal Reserve facility that was initially announced in November 2008 for the purpose of catalyzing the securitization markets, a critical component of the financial system and source of low cost credit to consumers and businesses; and
- Treasury announced a new framework of governance and oversight for financial institutions that will receive exceptional assistance, including better transparency on how taxpayer dollars are spent, and stronger conditions on lending, dividends, and executive compensation.

On February 18, 2009, President Barack Obama announced his broad, comprehensive strategy to stabilize the housing market and prevent foreclosures. One of the program's key components is a \$75 billion loan modification plan, of which Treasury will fund approximately \$50 billion through the TARP and Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac will fund approximately \$25 billion. The TARP funded program involves providing servicers and investors with incentives to modify loans.

As part of efforts to restore confidence in the domestic automotive industry, Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner and National Economic Council Director Larry Summers announced the creation and members of the Presidential Task Force on the Auto Industry on February 20, 2009. The Task Force is currently reviewing the restructuring reports that Treasury received from Chrysler LLC (Chrysler) and General Motors Corporation (GM) on February 17, 2009. Treasury is committed to implementing the FSP with the highest degree of transparency and accountability. Accordingly, on February 4, 2009, Treasury issued a new set of robust guidelines on executive pay for financial institutions that are receiving assistance under the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008 (EESA). Additional restrictions on executive compensation were signed into law on February 17, 2009, as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Treasury is in the process of drafting new regulations on these new executive compensation requirements.

In January 2008, Treasury launched a monthly bank lending survey as part of its commitment to Congress and the public to greater communication and transparency about its programs to stabilize the financial system. The survey captures data from the 20 largest recipients of funds under the Capital Purchase Program (CPP) and helps the public easily assess the lending and other intermediation activities of these banks during this unprecedented financial markets crisis and economic downturn. On February 17, 2009, Treasury published the results of this initial survey in a Snapshot, covering the period between October and December 2008 (the first three months of the CPP program). Treasury is conducting this survey on a monthly basis and will publish monthly Snapshots on Treasury's Web site, reflecting data from the previous month.

The Snapshot contains quantitative information on three major categories of lending – consumer, commercial, and other activities – based on banks' internal reporting, as well as commentary to explain changes in lending levels for each category. In addition, the Snapshot contains a qualitative section that provides market color on lending demand and credit standards generally to help Treasury and the public meaningfully and accurately interpret the quantitative data. In addition, efforts will be taken under the FSP to further enhance the public's understanding of banks' lending by requiring companies receiving future government funds under new programs to report to Treasury how the capital they receive preserves or generates new lending and their plans to strengthen their lending capacity.

On February 27, 2009, Treasury announced its willingness to participate in exchange offerings that Citigroup, Inc. (Citigroup) plans to conduct with all of its current preferred shareholders to the extent Citigroup is able to reach agreements with these other preferred holders and certain other conditions are met. Treasury would convert prior investments in Citigroup preferred shares previously received under the CPP into a new security that will convert into common shares, pending a shareholder vote to amend the Citigroup charter to allow for an increase in the number of authorized common shares. Treasury also would exchange Citigroup preferred shares received under the Targeted Investment Program in December 2008, and under the Asset Guarantee Program in January 2009, for a trust preferred security of greater structural seniority with the same 8% cash dividend rate as the existing preferred shares. This transaction will not increase the amount of Treasury's investment in Citigroup; however, it does increase the risk of the investment to the government.

II. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

This is Treasury's fourth *Section 105(a) Troubled Assets Relief Program Report to Congress* (TARP Report) required by the EESA. Treasury transmitted its third TARP Report to Congress on February 3, 2009, covering activities between January 1 and January 31, 2009. This TARP Report covers the following activities listed in EESA section 105(a) occurring through the end of February:

- An overview of actions taken by the Secretary, including the considerations required by section 103 and the efforts under section 109.
- The actual obligation and expenditure of the funds provided for administrative expenses by section 118.
- A detailed financial statement with respect to the exercise of authority, including:
 1. all agreements made or renewed;
 2. all insurance contracts entered into pursuant to section 102;
 3. all transactions occurring during the initial 60-day period, including the types of parties involved;
 4. the nature of the assets purchased;
 5. all projected costs and liabilities;
 6. operating expenses, including compensation for financial agents;
 7. the valuation or pricing method used for each transaction; and
 8. a description of the vehicles established to exercise such authority.

III. INDIVIDUAL PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

The Capital Purchase Program

The purpose of the Capital Purchase Program (CPP) is to stabilize the financial system by building the capital base of healthy, viable U.S. financial institutions, which in turn will increase the capacity of those institutions to lend to businesses and consumers and support the economy. Under this program, Treasury is purchasing senior preferred shares from qualifying U.S. controlled banks, savings associations, and certain bank and savings and loan holding companies. Between February 1 and February 28, 2009, Treasury purchased \$1.4 billion in senior preferred shares from 108 financial institutions under the CPP. Since the launch of the CPP in October 2008 through February 28, 2009, Treasury has invested a total of \$196.8 billion in senior preferred shares in 467 financial institutions in 47 states and Puerto Rico. Treasury designed the program to include every banking community in the country, and the 467 institutions Treasury

has funded under the CPP include small, community, regional, and national banks, as well as Community Development Financial Institutions. The application deadline for publicly-held institutions was November 14, 2008, the deadline for applications from eligible privately-held financial institutions was December 8, 2008, and the application deadline for S corporations was February 13, 2009. The federal banking regulators are evaluating all submitted CPP applications and continue to send qualifying applications to Treasury for final approval.

The Automotive Industry Financing Program

The objective of the Automotive Industry Financing Program (AIFP) is to prevent a significant disruption of the American automotive industry, which would pose a systemic risk to financial market stability and have a negative effect on the economy of the United States. Guidelines for the AIFP are published on Treasury's Web site.

On February 17, 2009, Treasury funded the remaining \$4 billion of the \$13.4 billion loan to General Motors Corporation (GM) that was discussed in detail in Treasury's second TARP Report to Congress. Treasury also amended the terms of both the GM loan and the Chrysler loan.

Consumer and Business Lending Initiative

In carrying out the FSP, the Federal Reserve and Treasury released further details on the Term Asset-Backed Securities Loan Facility (TALF) in February, including program terms and conditions, as well as questions and answers. The creation of the TALF was announced in November 2008 as a Federal Reserve facility to which Treasury will provide \$20 billion in funding through the TARP; subsequently, standardized terms have been developed. The Federal Reserve will lend on a non-recourse basis to holders of certain AAA-rated asset-backed securities (ABS) secured by newly and recently originated consumer and small business loans. TALF loans will have a term of 3 years and will be secured solely by eligible collateral. Haircuts (a percentage reduction used for collateral valuation) will be determined based on the riskiness of each type of eligible collateral and the maturity of the eligible collateral pledged to the Federal Reserve. The haircuts will provide additional protection to taxpayers by protecting the Federal Government from loss.

To promote accountability and oversight for the current facility, the participating sponsor must provide a certification to the effect that the collateral supporting the ABS is eligible under TALF and that an independent accounting firm registered with the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board has attested to the sponsor's assessment of the eligible collateral.

As part of the Consumer and Business Lending Initiative announced by the Secretary on February 10, 2009, Treasury and the Federal Reserve have agreed to include new eligible asset categories under the TALF.

Homeowner Affordability and Stability Plan

The Homeowner Affordability and Stability Plan will offer assistance to as many as 9 million homeowners making a good-faith effort to stay current on their mortgage payments, while

attempting to prevent the destructive impact of foreclosures on families and communities. This plan is being implemented pursuant to Sections 101 and 109 of the EESA.

Under this plan, eligible borrowers who are current on their mortgages but have been unable to refinance to lower their interest rates because their homes have decreased in value, may have the opportunity to refinance into a 30 or 15 year, fixed rate loan. This lower-cost refinancing program is limited to mortgage loans held in portfolio or securitized by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. The amount due on the new mortgage loan (including any refinancing costs) will not exceed 105% of the current market value of the mortgaged property.

The plan also includes a Homeowner Stability Initiative, which will operate through a partnership between Treasury and mortgage lenders to help borrowers avoid foreclosure by modifying at-risk loans to achieve a payment the borrower can afford. Borrowers must meet several eligibility requirements, including that the mortgaged property is the borrower's primary residence, the current monthly mortgage loan payment is greater than 31% of the borrower's monthly gross income, and the mortgage loan amount does not exceed current Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac conforming loan limits.

To encourage foreclosure mitigation efforts, Treasury will provide mortgage loan servicers up-front and "pay for success" fees for eligible loan modifications made to borrowers on a timely basis. Treasury also will pay a fee incentive to a borrower who continues to stay current on his or her mortgage loan. Treasury plans to create a \$10 billion insurance fund, designed to discourage lenders from opting to foreclose on mortgaged properties located in a declining housing market.

To protect taxpayers, the Homeowner Stability Initiative also will focus on sound modifications. The Treasury is currently working closely with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and other bank agencies to develop uniform guidance for loan modifications across the mortgage industry to bring order and consistency to foreclosure mitigation.

Capital Assistance Program

On February 10, 2009, Treasury announced the Capital Assistance Program (CAP), which is designed to ensure the continued ability of U.S. financial institutions to lend to creditworthy borrowers in the face of a weaker than expected economic environment and larger than expected potential losses. The CAP consists of 2 core elements aimed at restoring confidence in the conditions of the U.S. banking system: a supervisory exercise and a new Treasury capital access program for qualifying financial institutions.

The first element is a forward-looking supervisory exercise on the part of the four federal banking regulators, who have long worked with the major banking organizations. The federal banking or thrift supervisor will undertake a coordinated supervisory capital planning exercise or

“stress test” with each of 19 major U.S. banking organizations with assets in excess of \$100 billion. The stress test will determine whether major financial institutions have the additional capital buffer necessary to continue lending and to absorb potential losses in a worse than expected economic downturn. If the respective federal banking or thrift supervisor concludes that there is a need to establish an additional capital buffer, the bank will have a 6-month window to raise that capital privately or to access the capital made available by Treasury under the CAP. Eligible U.S. financial institutions with consolidated assets below \$100 billion may also apply and obtain capital from the CAP.

The second component under the CAP is a new capital access program, under which Treasury will purchase mandatory convertible preferred shares from qualified financial institutions. In accordance with the considerations of the EESA, a broad spectrum of financial institutions is eligible for the program: U.S. controlled banks, savings associations, and certain bank and savings and loan holding companies. A recommendation on acceptance is received from the institution’s primary federal regulator or, in some cases, from a council of representatives from each federal regulator. Treasury is responsible for final approval.

The investment limit under the CAP is between 1% and 2% of total risk-weighted assets, plus any amount of CAP convertible preferred shares to the extent the proceeds are used to redeem preferred shares sold under the CPP and, if applicable, Treasury’s Targeted Investment Program. The convertible preferred shares mandatorily convert to common stock after 7 years at a specified conversion price. Standardized terms have been developed for institutions that are organized as publicly traded institutions; terms applicable to privately held institutions, S corporations, and mutual organizations are still under consideration. The standardized terms also impose provisions (such as the issuance of warrants) that will enable the taxpayer to benefit from the future appreciation of the financial institution. Additionally, firms must agree to comply with enhanced restrictions with respect to executive compensation, transparency, accountability, and monitoring.

Citigroup

On February 27, 2009, Treasury announced its willingness to participate in exchange offerings that Citigroup, Inc. (Citigroup) would conduct with all of its current preferred shareholders. Citigroup plans to exchange a significant portion of its preferred securities to common equity in order to increase its tangible common equity. Citigroup will commence the exchange offerings after reaching agreements with its other preferred holders.

Treasury agreed to participate in Citigroup’s exchange offerings if certain conditions are met. Treasury would convert only the amount of Citigroup preferred shares that Citigroup’s other preferred shareholders are willing to convert in these exchange offerings and must receive the most favorable terms and price offered to any other preferred holder through this exchange. Under the exchange offerings, Treasury would convert up to \$25 billion of its preferred stock issued in accordance with the CPP into a new security that will convert into common shares,

pending a shareholder vote to amend the Citigroup charter to allow for an increase in the number of authorized common shares. Treasury also would exchange its \$20 billion investment in Citigroup preferred shares received under the Targeted Investment Program on December 31, 2008 (discussed in Treasury's second TARP Report to Congress), and the Citigroup preferred shares received by Treasury under the Asset Guarantee Program on January 16, 2009 (discussed in Treasury's third TARP Report to Congress), for trust preferred shares of greater structural seniority with the same 8% cash dividend rate as the existing preferred shares.

IV. Certification

As the Interim Assistant Secretary for the Office of Financial Stability at the United States Department of the Treasury, I am the official with delegated authority to approve purchases of troubled assets under the Troubled Assets Relief Program. I certify to the Congress that each decision of my office to approve purchases of troubled assets, from the beginning of the program until the end of this reporting period, was based on my office's evaluation of the facts and circumstances of each proposed investment, including recommendations from regulators, in order to promote financial stability and the other purposes of the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008.

Note: Treasury interprets this reporting requirement as applicable to costs and liabilities related to insurance contracts entered into under the provisions of section 102 of the EESA; and the single insurance contract with Citigroup is structured such that no costs are anticipated, i.e. the currently anticipated cash inflows of the contract slightly exceed anticipated cash outflows.

The subsidy rate for this insurance contract is determined to be -0.25 percent. Per EESA section 102(c)(3), premiums shall be set at a level necessary to meet anticipated claims. To ensure that the guarantee remains compliant with section 102(c)(3), the Master Agreement provides for post-signing adjustments including additional Citigroup preferred stock, a reduction of the covered asset pool, and/or an increased Citigroup deductible (section 5.2 of the Master Agreement). Under this section of the agreement, the subsidy rate will be reassessed once the loan pools are finalized and details are provided to Treasury (changes in the composition of assets are expected). Citigroup must either transfer more preferred stock or absorb more in first losses (it is unlikely the size of the asset pool would be reduced), if it is found that the risks of the assets in the loan pool exceed those estimated today and would not meet the requirements of EESA section 102(c)(3). This "true-up" would occur over the next 8 months.
