**Executive Order 13566
Blocking Property and Prohibiting Certain Transactions Related to Libya**

GENERAL LICENSE NO. 2

Libyan Diplomatic Missions in the United States

(1) The provision of goods or services in the United States to the diplomatic missions of the Government of Libya to the United States and the United Nations and payment for such goods or services are authorized, provided that:

(a) The goods or services are for the conduct of the official business of the missions, or for personal use of the employees of the missions, and are not for resale;

(b) The transaction does not involve the purchase, sale, financing, or refinancing of real property;

(c) The transaction is not otherwise prohibited by law; and

(d) The transaction is conducted through an account at a U.S. financial institution specifically licensed by OFAC.


(2) The provision of goods or services in the United States to the employees of the diplomatic missions of the Government of Libya to the United States and the United Nations and payment for such goods or services are authorized, provided that:

(1) The goods or services are for personal use of the employees of the missions, and are not for resale; and

(2) The transaction is not otherwise prohibited by law.

NOTE TO PARAGRAPH (1)(d) OF GENERAL LICENSE NO. 2. U.S. financial institutions are required to obtain specific licenses to operate accounts for, or extend credit to, the diplomatic missions of the Government of Libya to the United States and the United Nations.

NOTE TO GENERAL LICENSE NO. 2: Nothing in this general license authorizes the transfer of any property to the Government of Libya, its agencies, instrumentalities, and controlled entities, the Central Bank of Libya, or any person whose property and interests in property are blocked pursuant to Executive Order 13566 of February 25, 2011, "Blocking Property and Prohibiting Certain Transactions Related to Libya" other than the diplomatic missions of the Government of Libya to the United States and the United Nations, nor does this general license authorize any debit to a blocked account other than as authorized herein.
