Executive Order of September 21, 2017  
Imposing Additional Sanctions with Respect to North Korea

GENERAL LICENSE NO. 10

Calling of Certain Vessels and Landing of Certain Aircraft Authorized

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), vessels and aircraft in which a foreign person has an interest that have called or landed at a port or place in North Korea within the previous 180 days, and vessels in which a foreign person has an interest that have engaged in a ship-to-ship transfer with such a vessel within the previous 180 days, are authorized to call or land at a port or place in the United States in the following circumstances only:

(1) The vessel is in distress and seeks refuge in the United States;


(2) The vessel's call at a port in North Korea was due solely to its distress and the resulting need to seek refuge;

(3) The aircraft is engaging in a nontraffic stop or an emergency landing in the United States; or

**Note to paragraph (a)(3):** A nontraffic stop is a stop for any purpose other than taking on or discharging cargo, passengers, or mail.

(4) The aircraft's landing in North Korea was due solely to an emergency.

(b) This general license does not authorize any transaction by a United States person prohibited by Executive Order 13687 of January 2, 2015, Executive Order 13722 of March 16, 2016, 31 C.F.R. part 510, or any other part of chapter V of 31 C.F.R.
